- I. The meeting was called to order by chair, Trish Watkins, at 9:31 AM
- II. A motion was made, seconded, and passed to adopt the agenda
- III. Roll Call – Elon Turner
- IV. Campus Updates
 - a. Human Resources Updates – Debbie McLoud
 - i. Human Resources is finishing up processing salary increases and year-end accounting
 - ii. Gearing up for school to begin
 - iii. Increasing the number of postings for positions on campus
 - iv. Several staffing changes in HR
 1. An opening for Assistant Director of Classification and Compensation to be posted
 - v. Background check fees are adding up
 1. Make offers contingent on background checks versus running background checks on all candidates to reduce overall cost
 - vi. Workday design sessions are on going
 1. Data discovery still underway
 2. Testing begins early spring 2020
 3. Workday is still set to go live July 2020
 4. Workday will not eliminate any positions
 - b. Parking and Transit Updates – Michela Cupello
 - i. Faulkner Plaza is scheduled to be completed August 12
 - ii. Razorback Rd is now open
 - iii. Maple St between Stadium Dr and Garland Ave is scheduled to be closed from August 8 until August 14
 - iv. The intersection of Maple and Garland will be closed for one day between 08/09/2019 and 08/14/2019, but the exact day has yet to be set
 - v. Residence move in day is August 15
 1. All resident reserved lots, faculty/staff lot 62 and faculty/staff lot 37 will be closed for move-in day usage from 5 PM Wednesday, August 14 until the afternoon of Monday, August 19
 - a. Traffic should be heavy those days, so please plan accordingly
 - vi. 90 faculty/staff spaces have been removed from lot 38
 1. 90 faculty/staff spaces have been relocated to lot 78
 - vii. The Leroy Pond extension is on schedule to be completed by August 19
 - viii. Bus stops will remain the same as the spring semester
 1. A temporary stop will be added in front of the Administration building at the top of Maple in the circle drive
